Community Open House | November 13 New Public Works Facility

Please join us on November 13 at the Community Open House from 5:30 PM to 7:00 PM to view our new public works facility, and to get an inside look at the inner workings of the public works department. This has been a long time in the making and we are excited to share it with you.

The old public works shop had been a subject of concern since the year 2000 and was discussed many times in terms of capacity, efficiency and seismic stability. The old building had a multitude of issues ranging from deficient workspace and storage capacities to having no fire suppression system and not being ADA accessible. The primary concern, however, was its' seismic instability and the fact that it posed a risk to life safety in the event of an earthquake.



The City Council directed staff to assess the alternatives for solving these issues. After a year of research and planning, including insight from two public forums in 2017, the City Council awarded a contract for Progressive Design Build to P & C Construction and LSR Architects in February 2018 at a negotiated Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP). Work began in April 2019 and the work is now substantially complete, on time and under budget. The improvement's include an additional mezzanine space for future expansion, a fire sprinkler system, half street improvements to Main and 1st Streets, new landscaping, and furnishings.

How will the 2020 Census impact our community?

Census information is used to ease overcrowded classrooms and overcrowded commutes. The 2020 Census data will be used in many ways to shape our community. The results, collected every 10 years, will help **determine how billions of dollars** in federal funding is allocated each year within Oregon. In 2016, Oregon received over 13 billion dollars, which was used across the state to fund programs like:

- Federal Pell Grants
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
- Business and Industry Loans



Census data was used by responders during the Eagle Creek Fire. The Census data is used by our community to respond to natural disasters. In 2017, the Eagle Creek Fire started in September and burned for almost 3 months, destroying approximately 50,000 acres in the Cascade Locks. Emergency responders used census data to estimate the number of people in the area that potentially needed to be evacuated. Our community deserves to have the right level of emergency response and we can get that by counting every community member in the 2020 Census.
